ACTIVITIES AND PERFORMANCES

1. Food & clothes Dist. To needy people



There are many people in our locality – in the rural and slum areas of Jalandhar district, who are in need of basic facility like food, clothes and healthcare, our team try to help them as possible as we can. This year our volunteers help approx hundred people by provide them food and clothes. Due to weak financial condition they have to face many troubles in daily life – migrant workers, rickshaw pullers, street vendors and people live in slum areas – they have livelihood problem several times because due to lack of education and knowledge they can't able to get a simple job and have to struggle for basic needs in daily life.



2. Education for poor children -

Our youth volunteers provide free education to those children who can't afford expensive classes and deprived of education, even they can't complete their primary level education, so our aim to complete their basic education at least from our initiative.

We have a team of youth students who teach those children with keep continue their study, and also help them by provide study materials according to need.

They also visit in rural and slum areas to aware their parents for send their children for study not for work in young age, because they have mentality that – education can't feed them and also due to financial problem they send their children for work in less age.



3. Health Camp (Check-up & medicine Distribution)



Poor people ignore small health issues due to expensive health care support, so we made a medical team of health experts who visit one day in week for serve the needy people and provide free health services – checkups, small treatment and medicine distribution according to need, and if anyone is in serious condition then we arrange an ambulance and help them in further proceedings.

4. Environment protection awareness & plantation



This year our team members have been planted more than fifty trees – including fruits trees and Peepal, Neem and other trees which provide shadow, in today's time it's most need social work to do because global warming is increasing day by day and all types of pollution – air, water, soil and sound also increasing and it will be more horrible after sometime if we will not be serious about protect nature in present time, our team also aware other people to do the same.

5. Save girl child awareness & education for them



Through this campaign our team aware people to give equal rights to both boys and girls children, Girls have the right same right to education as boys. Educated girls can make informed choices - and from a far better range of options. Educating girls saves lives and builds stronger families, communities and economies.

An educated female population increases a country's productivity and fuels economic growth. Some countries lose more than \$1 billion a year by failing to educate girls to the same level as boys.

7. Women empowerment activities -
