ACTIVITIES AND PERFORMANCES

1. Covid-19 precaution awareness -

In the year 2020-21 the corona virus has been affected every thing in the whole world and poor people affected the most – for keep safe people from this virus our team members has been spread awareness about take precautions from covid-19 like – always wear mask, use sanitizer and maintain social distancing, because people who have lack of knowledge about corona virus they believe on rumors and have wrong mentality about virus, our team visit specially in rural and slum areas of our locality to aware people about to follow government guidelines and take full precaution, do not believe on wrong rumors and if they need other types of help – like healthcare, ration and masks then our members will provide according to capacity.





2. Medical camp - checkup & medicine distribution

Health awareness camp

There is nothing more important than our good health, - that's our principal capital asset.

In Health sector we are working for awareness and check-up, treatment and medicine distribution to needy people time to time. We invite health experts for check-up camp and our volunteers team do a survey of those people who are suffering from any type of health issues because of bad financial condition and unable to treat their health problems, and give them information of time and venue of health camp, they come and we help as possible as we can.

It helps people being healthy and we also spread awareness about precautions and care about their health.





3. Food and masks distribution to Needy

During the covid-19 pandemic our organization has been distributed ration — rice, flour, pulse, oil and species and masks — sanitizers to needy families (approx 150 families).







4. Food for stray animals

Stray dogs and cats live in harsh conditions, so they carry germs and diseases as they eat out of garbage and things lying on the floor, which domesticated/pets do not. Therefore, the ones at home are pretty clean and with fewer germs and the ones outside have a lot of germs infesting on them.



5. Agricultural development activities -

We organize seminars for farmers about provide them knowledge about modern and organic farming. The Agriculture in Punjab state is highly intensive in terms of land, capital, energy, nutrients, agriculture inputs and water etc. With only 1.5% of geographical area of the country, Punjab has produced about 22% of wheat, 10% of rice and 13% of cotton of the total produce of these crops in the country during 2001-02. The largest grown crop is wheat. Other important crops are rice, cotton, sugarcane, pearl millet, finger millet, sorghum, maize, barley and fruits. Among the fodder crops are bajra and jowar.

6. Old age people welfare activities

The life of elders in the present age is full of problems, both for themselves and for the children. The fortunate few depart with satisfaction and peace of mind, while others leave with an unhappy state of mind. Meanwhile, the OAHs have come to be a part of our social system. Thus, most of the elders in OAHs are not very happy, confined as they are to isolation. Unfortunately, children are unable to come on time when parents fall sick or even die in OAHs. But there are some elders who feel comfortable in OAHs for the freedom and friendly atmosphere with other elders who keep them company, enjoying the time with TV, games and gossip. They show some detachment from family members and feel more secure in OAHs and avoid a restricted life with their children.



7. Skill development training for youth

For youth employment we provide training program of skill development, like computer software and hardware training, stitching and embroidery training for girls, and other types of skills need according to situation every year. In everyday life, the development of life skills helps students to: Find new ways of thinking and problem solving. Build confidence both in spoken skills and for group collaboration and cooperation. Analyze options, make decisions and understand why they make certain choices outside the classroom. In today's age of globalization and technological volatility, skill building is an important instrument to increase the efficacy and quality of labor for improved productivity and economic growth. Skill building is a powerful tool to empower individuals and improve their social acceptance.

8. Disability welfare program

As a society, it is our utmost duty to allow people with disabilities to experience a life they deserve. Disability awareness helps in subsiding the stereotypical mindset of the society, hence providing vast opportunities for everyone to get involved in creating a positive, inclusive society for all.



11. Awareness on social issues

As we all know that Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered coronavirus. Most people infected with the COVID-19 virus will experience mild to moderate respiratory illness and recover without requiring special treatment.
